In its first 3 years, the program recognized and certified 18 cities representing nearly 3 million people. Rebecca also spearheaded creation of Solar CitiSuns, a public facing community of renewable energy advocates designed to build a bigger support base of engaged citizens.

Rebecca previously worked as a Community Energy Coordinator and managed numerous renewable energy and energy efficiency programs. She earlier launched and edited numerous magazines-- for clients include home builders, hospitals, and a clean energy nonprofit. She came to her work on clean energy after a nationally awardwinning career as a newspaper reporter and editor.
